Abstracts must contain:

- Abstract Title (100 character maximum)
- Presenter Name
- Author List
- Authors' Institution(s) and Department(s)
- Contact Email
- Maximum 250 word abstract

Abstracts will be reviewed and selected according to the following criteria:

- 1) Scientific merit and novelty of the research
- 2) Presence of sufficient experimental data to support the conclusion
- 3) Relevance to the field of biomedical engineering
- 4) Overall clarity and quality of the technical writing

GUIDELINES FOR POSTER PRESENTERS:

- Poster dimensions must not exceed 48" by 48"
- All posters must be set up in the atrium by 9:00AM on Friday, September 13th.
- Presenters must be present at their poster during the judging window on September 13th.
- Research may have been previously presented at a regional, national, or international conference.

GUIDELINES FOR ORAL PRESENTERS:

- Each presenter selected for an oral presentation will be given a 15 minute time slot. 10 minutes will be allotted for their presentation, while 5 minutes will be allotted for Q&A with the audience.
- Final slides must be submitted by Wednesday, September 11th at 5 PM.
 Additional details will be provided to presenters upon abstract acceptance.
